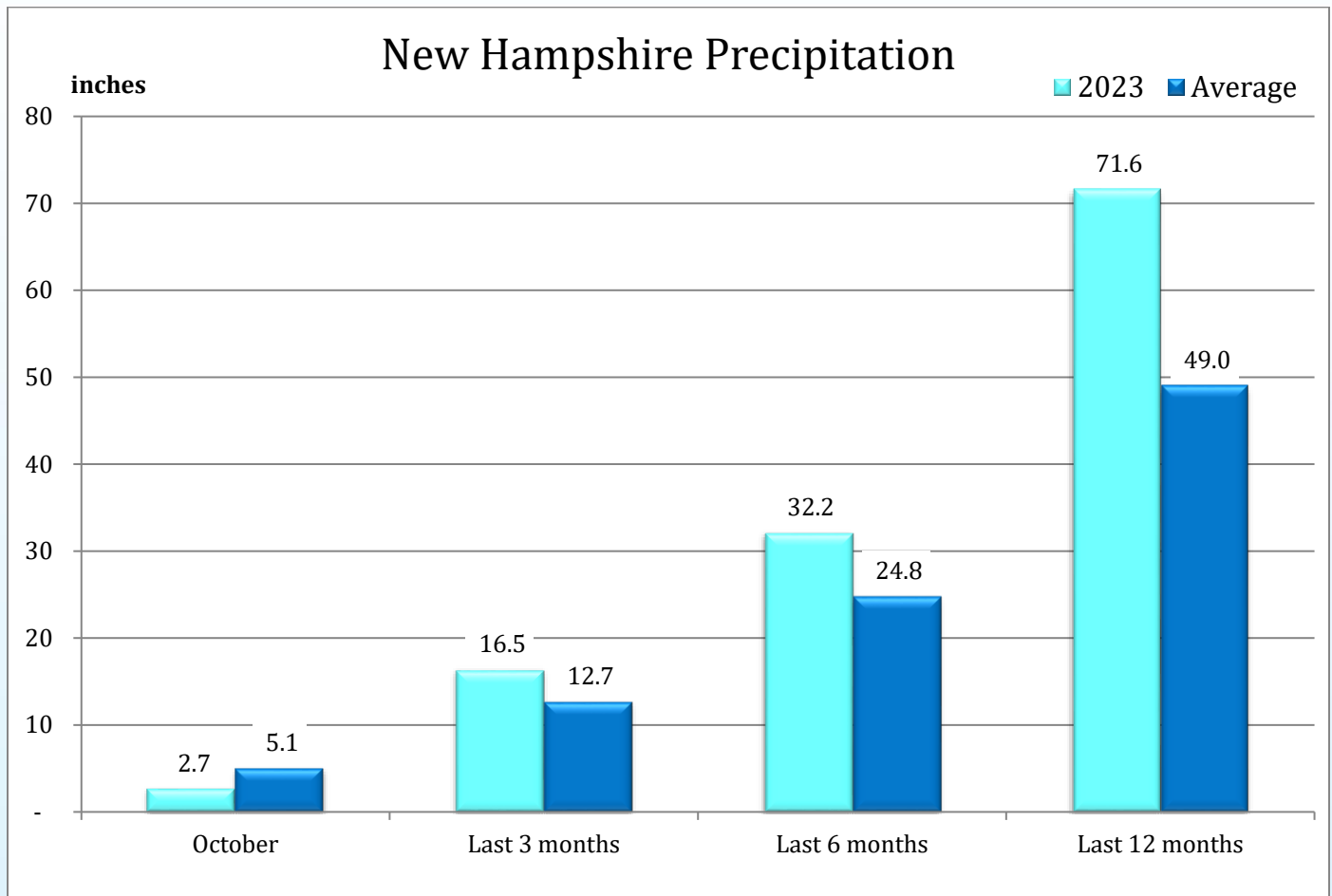


Water Supply Update

Weather Trends/Outlook

Rainfall in October was 2.7 inches; about half of the long-term average of 5.1 inches, yet higher than average precipitation over the past year has alleviated previous drought conditions. The U.S. Drought Monitor map shows no dry or drought conditions currently in any of Aquarion’s service areas.
