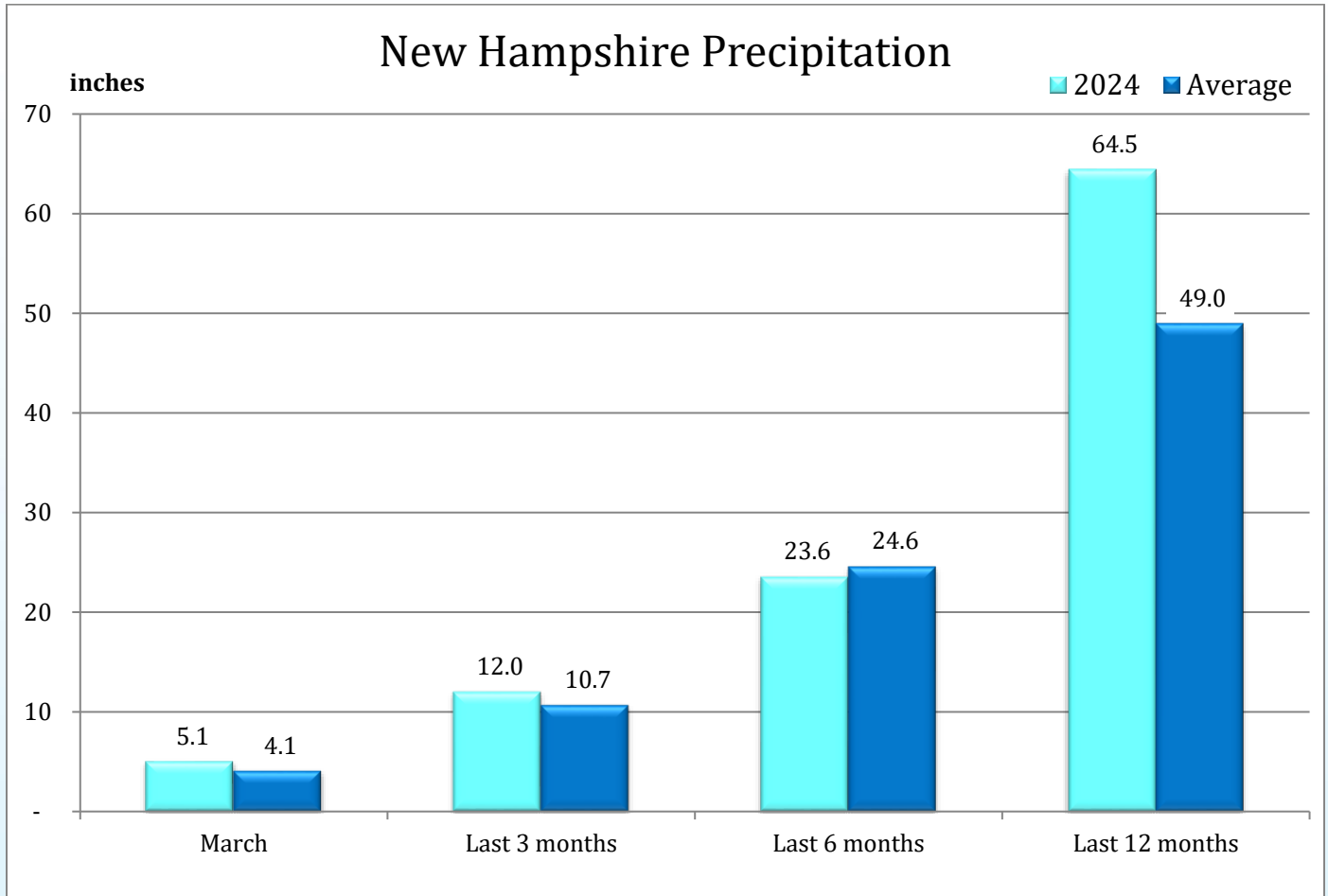

Weather Trends/Outlook

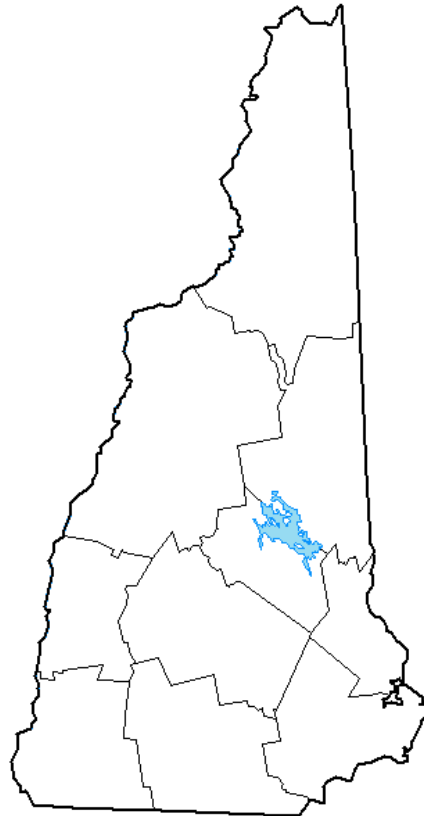









U.S. Drought Monitor New Hampshire
