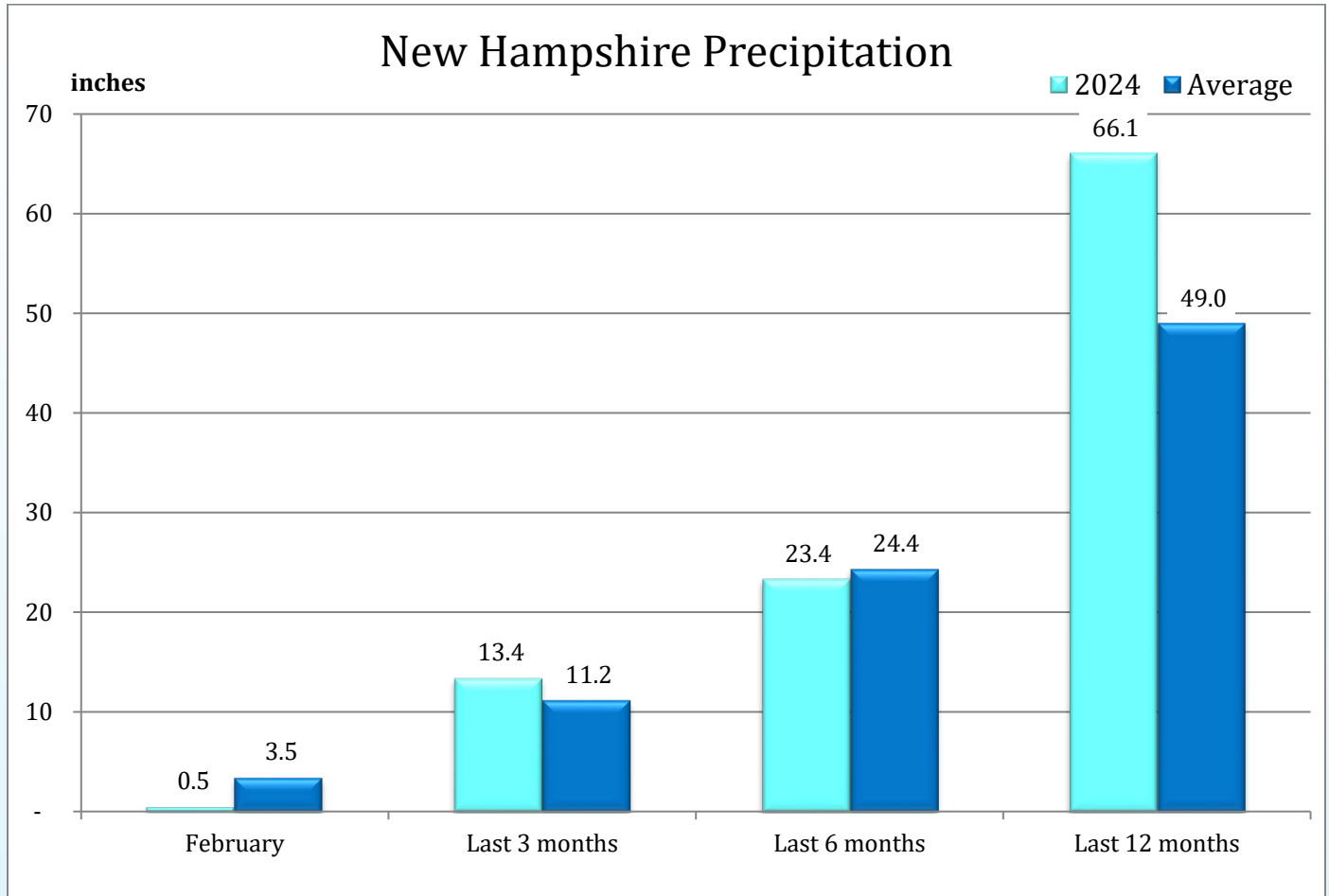


# Water Supply Update









# U.S. Drought Monitor New Hampshire
